OUR STORY

Aks Foundation is registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 (Central) and under the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act 1950. Though primarily a Pune-centric NGO working in the area of Gender-Based Violence (GBV), domestic violence, sexual abuse, and harassment, Aks also provides support to victims across the country. It provides support to victims of abuse and violence in order to empower them to become survivors.

INCEPTION

Idea formed in founder Barkha Bajaj's mind while studying in the United States. Inspired by her work with survivors of abuse, violence, and trauma.

Goal: Replicate support systems for survivors and victims in India.

EXECUTION PLAN

- Organized a fundraiser to support the mission.
- Conducted training for first batch of volunteers.
- Launched Aks Crisis Line on 15th August 2013.

CATALYST

The Nirbhaya incident in 2012, Aks organized and conducted a silent candlelight March and then transformed the initial idea into a certainty.

OBJECTIVE OF 24X7 CRISIS LINE

- Ensure round the clock availability for individuals in crisis.
- Provide a listening ear to victims during times of emergency.





MISSION

To empower survivors of gender-based violence through compassionate 24/7 intervention, legal guidance and community education.

OUR THREE-PRONGED APPROACH

We don't just respond to crises we build pathways to empowerment. Whether it's a midnight call, legal clarity, or a workshop that shifts a mindset, Aks Foundation is where change begins.

Z 24/7 Crisis Helpline

- India's only 24/7 national helpline exclusively for survivors of Gender-Based Violence.
- Stringent volunteer selection process including interviews, in-depth training (designed by Aks) and practice sessions.
- Operated by 50+ trained multilingual, pan India volunteers.
- Empathetic and confidential emotional support available.
- Technology enabled by Exotel for call automation.
- Working with law enforcement to dispatch help when someone is in immediate danger including reporting child sexual abuse matters.
- Empower the callers with local resources available.

Legal Advisory

- Legal guidance for survivors of Gender-Based Violence through trained legal volunteers.
- Follow-up legal support on issues including: FIR/NC filing, Domestic Violence Act, POCSO Act, POSH Act, Divorce and custody laws.
- Legal volunteers undergo specialized training on modules designed by Aks before engaging with survivors.

POSH Advisory Services:

- Support with Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) formation.
- Review and alignment of company policies with POSH compliance.
- Participation as external ICC members for organizations.

Community Education

- Workshops on gender sensitization,
 POSH, women's rights, and child safety.
- PROJECT PROTSAHAN: Individual and Group counselling at Observation Home for Juvenile Children, Yerwada, Pune.

IN THE WORDS OF OUR FOUNDER:

The Origin and Growth of Aks Foundation

I returned to India in 2009 after completing my Master's in Counseling Psychology and working with Denton County Friends of the Family in Texas. For nearly five years, I had worked with survivors and perpetrators of domestic violence and sexual abuse. Despite my experience, upon returning to India, I got swept up in the pace of life here. While the idea of Aks had already taken root, at that time it was a one-woman initiative focused primarily on awareness programs.

Everything changed in December 2012. The horrific Nirbhaya case shook the nation and me. The very next day, I was traveling alone by train to the Northeast. My compartment had no other women, and I was gripped by fear. I remember vividly: I slept with my boots on and kept red chilli powder in my bag just in case. That night, I embodied the collective fear that countless women across the country were feeling.

The next morning, as I reached Dimapur, I began searching for a women's helpline I could have called that night. Shockingly, there were no 24/7 crisis helplines for women in India at the time. That moment sparked the idea that became the Aks Crisis Line.

I returned to Pune, trained our first group of six volunteers, and organized a fundraiser to get the helpline operational. We applied for NGO status, and on 15th August 2013—Independence Day—we officially launched the Aks 24/7 Crisis and Legal Helpline. The date was symbolic: I firmly believe that none of us are truly free until all of us are free.

From 2013 to 2025, Aks has grown from strength to strength. Today, we are the top Google search result for keywords like "domestic violence" and "sexual abuse"—a recognition we're proud of, especially as it stemmed from a collaboration initiated by Google. From just six volunteers, we now have a team of over 60 dedicated volunteers and a core team of 10, with each vertical of Aks being independently managed by committed team members.





One of the initiatives closest to my heart is Project Protsahan, where we work directly with juvenile offenders and perpetrators of violence. We provide individual and group counseling to children in juvenile homes and conduct workshops on gender-based violence and consent. Having started my career as a therapist working with perpetrators, this project feels especially meaningful. It addresses the root of the issue—focusing not just on supporting survivors but also on transforming those who cause harm. I believe real change begins when we raise our boys differently.

Today, Aks continues to bring change by spreading awareness across schools, colleges, and bastis in Pune. The journey has taken years of hard work, resilience, and more sleepless nights than I can count. There were moments I wanted to give up, but I'm deeply grateful to my core team and volunteers who have stood by me through it all. They are the reason Aks exists—and thrives—today.

While endeavouring to provide compassionate, comprehensive services to those impacted by Gender-Based Violence (domestic violence, sexual abuse, and harassment), Aks also looks at partnering with the community to promote safety, awareness, and prevention of Gender-Based Violence. Aks trainers and community ambassadors to venture into schools, colleges, and the local community to raise awareness and conduct workshops on gender related topics.









BITTER REALITY:



The WHO estimates that between 25%–50% of Indian women suffer intimate partner violence in their lifetime.



40% of female suicides globally occur in India; domestic violence is a major risk factor.



Research indicates male victims suffer from anxiety, depression, substance abuse, and suicidal tendencies.



NCRB data shows married men commit suicide at 3–5× higher rates than married women in age 30–60, with "family problems" as a leading factor.




























TAKE BACK THE NIGHT

D's Story: Finding Hope and Strength

D's life was filled with challenges. She had endured abuse by male cousins, rape, bullying, and body shaming, which left her feeling broken and worthless. In her present situation, D was unemployed, financially dependent, and stuck in an abusive relationship with her live-in partner. Feeling hopeless and alone, she turned to counselling as a last resort, seeking someone who would simply listen.

In a safe and compassionate space, D began to open up about her pain. Over six sessions, she started to see her inner strength and resilience, which had been buried under years of hardship. With newfound courage, D made the brave decision to leave her abusive partner. She also confronted him about his behavior, setting boundaries for her well-being.

D's story shows the power of being heard and supported. Her journey of starting to taking control of her life is a powerful reminder of the strength within us all.
